

Graduate and Professional Student Senate (GPSS)

What does GPSS do? The Graduate and Professional Student Senate (GPSS) represents the graduate and professional students' perspective on campus issues and serves as a liaison between graduate/professional students and the university administration.

How often does GPSS meet? GPSS meets the last Monday of each academic month. Meetings usually begin at 7pm. Attendance at each meeting is mandatory, as you are serving as an ELPS representative and are responsible for helping to decide important issues that may impact your fellow ELPS students. Failure to attend meetings will result in dismissal from GPSS, and your seat will be replaced.

How do I get involved with GPSS? At the end of each year, the HEGSO president will send out an email to all ELPS students letting them know how many GPSS seats are available. If you are interested in serving on GPSS, contact the HEGSO president for required paperwork.
